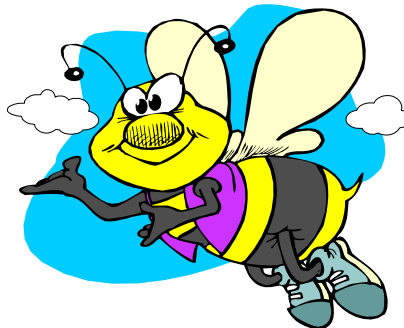

She is highly requested and always keeps herself booked two weeks in advance. We like to take this time to say THANK



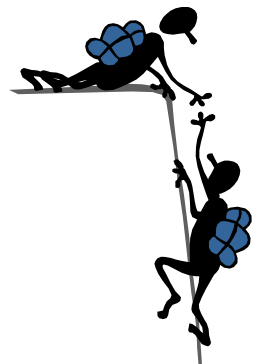

Heads or Tails Walk

Age 18 months or older

Begin your walk (if parents gave you written permission to take the child out the room) at the front of the guest's door. Have the child flip a coin. If it's heads, turn right. If it's tails turn left. Every time you get to a corner, end of sidewalk, end of hallway, etc. flip the coin

again. Have the children try to guess where your walk will lead.



Remember to have children within eye sight at all times!

Hunt the Thimble

Age 4 or older

Here's what you need:

thimble, acorn, stone, or other small object

1. Send children to the bathroom or to adjacent room, and place the thimble in a spot where children can see it without moving furniture or

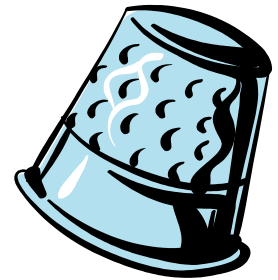
other objects. You might place it on a bookshelf, inside a cup, or on the window sill, for example.

2. Call children back into the room to hunt for it. Explain that when they see it, they must not say anything or point to it but rather sit down quietly.

Continue until all children have spotted the missing thimble. Switch and have

one of the children hide the thimble.

Continue until all kids have had a turn hiding the thimble.

What you need:

Empty Baby Food Jar (Clean)

Small Plastic Figurines

Glitter

Water

Glue

1. Glue figurine to baby food jar lid.
2. Fill jars with water and add glitter.
3. Screw lids tightly onto jars. Make sure figurine is completely dry before securing lid.

Let parents know that lids can be

removed which may lead to leaks. Once they get home they may want to apply contact cement or Stix All to the lid.
